Historical Shetch.

The Church in Curtisville was originally an offshoot from the Congregational Church in Stockbridge. At an Ecclesiastical Council convened Dec. 22nd, 1824, in what is known as the Old Red Schoolhouse, sixty-two members of that Church presented credentials of good standing, and were organized as the north Congregational Church in Stockbridge.

An Ecclesiastical Society had been formed in the early part of the same year, and Sabbath services had been regularly established.

This action was the result of difficulties growing out of the building of a new house of worship nearly a mile south of the old site. The Red School-house was used by the new church for public worship until the completion of its church edifice, which was dedicated Jan. 10, 1827. This building was of brick and stood nearly opposite the "Perry Place." In the year 1834 it was taken down and rebuilt where it now stands. The adjoining Chapel was erected at a cost of fifteen hundred dollars and on the tenth of March, 1884, was formally set apart to its intended uses.

The Church has had but 6 settled Pastors, covering an aggregate period of about 15 years. Its stated supplies number 15, varying in terms of service from 6 months to 8 years. The list of Deacons numbers 11, of whom only 4 died in office. The whole number of members of the Church from the beginning is 552. The present membership is 110.

The Doctrinal Statement, "Form of Admission," and Standing Rules as revised in the present manual, were adopted in place of those hitherto in use, at a business meeting of the Church held March 2nd, 1888.

Statement of Doctzine.

1. We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible;

And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who is of one sub-

stance with the Father; by whom all things were made;

And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life, who is sent from the Father and Son, and who together with the Father and Son is worshiped and glorified.

2. We believe that the Providence of God, by which He executes His eternal purposes in the government of the world, is in and over all events; yet so that the freedom and responsibility of man are

not impaired, and sin is the act of the creature alone.

3. We believe that man was made in the image of God, that he might know, love, and obey God, and enjoy him forever; that our first parents, by disobedience, fell under the righteous condemnation of God; and that all men are so alienated from God, that there is no salvation from the guilt and power of sin, except through God's redeeming grace.

4. We believe that God would have all men return to Him; that to this end He has made himself known, not only through the works of nature, the course of providence, and the consciences of men, but also through supernatural revelations made especially to a chosen people, and above all, when the fullness of time was come,

through Jesus Christ his Son.

5. We believe that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments are the record of God's revelation of himself in the work of redemption; that they were written by men under the special guidance of the Holy Spirit; that they are able to make wise unto salvation; and that they constitute the authoritative standard by which religious teaching and human conduct are to be regulated and judged.

6. We believe that the love of God to sinful men has found its highest expression in the redemptive work of His Son, who became man, uniting his divine nature with our human nature in one person; who was tempted like other men, yet without sin; who by his humiliation, his holy obedience, his sufferings, his death on the cross, and

his resurrection, became a perfect Redeemer; whose sacrifice of himself for the sins of the world declares the righteousness of God, and is the sole and sufficient ground of forgiveness and of reconciliation with him.

- 7. We believe that Jesus Christ, after he had risen from the dead, ascended into heaven, where, as the one Mediator between God and man, he carries forward his work of saving men; that he sends the Holy Spirit to convict them of sin, and to lead them to repentance and faith; and that those who through renewing grace turn to right-eousness, and trust in Jesus Christ as their Redeemer, receive for his sake the forgiveness of their sins, and are made the children of God.
- 8. We believe that those who are thus regenerated and justified, grow in sanctified character through fellowship with Christ, the indwelling of the Holy Spirit, and obedience to the truth; that a holy life is the fruit and evidence of saving faith; and that the believer's hope of continuance in such a life is in the preserving grace of God.

- 9. We believe that Jesus Christ came to establish among men the kingdom of God, the reign of truth and love, righteousness and peace; that to Jesus Christ, the Head of this kingdom, Christians are directly responsible in faith and conduct; and that to him all have immediate access without mediatorial or priestly intervention.
- 10. We believe that the Church of Christ, invisible and spiritual, comprises all true believers, whose duty it is to associate themselves in churches, for the maintenance of worship, and for the conversion of men; that these churches, under the guidance of the Holy Scriptures and in fellowship with one another, may determine—each for itself—their organization, statements of belief, and forms of worship, may appoint and set apart their own ministers, and should co-operate in the work which Christ has committed to them for the furtherance of the gospel throughout the world.
- 11. We believe in the observance of the Lord's Day, as a day of holy rest and worship; in the ministry of the word; and in the two sacraments, which Christ has appointed for his church: Baptism, to be administered to believers and their children, as the sign of cleansing from sin, of union to Christ, and of the impartation of the Holy Spirit; and the Lord's Supper as a symbol of his atoning death, a seal of its efficiency, and a means whereby he confirms and strengthens the spiritual union and communion of believers with himself.
- 12. We believe in the ultimate prevalence of the kingdom of Christ over all the earth; in the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ; in the resurrection of the dead; and in a final judgment, the issues of which are everlasting punishment and everlasting life.

Form of admission.

Come, and let us join ourselves to the Lord in a perpetual coven-

ant that shall not be forgotten.—Jer. 50: 5.

Whosoever therefore shall confess Me before men, him will I confess also before My Father, which is in heaven. But whosoever shall deny Me before men, him will I also deny before My Father, which is in heaven.—Matt. 10: 32, 33.

For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness; and with the

mouth confession is made unto salvation.—Rom. 10: 10.

Dearly Beloved: Called of God to be His children through Jesus Christ our Lord, you are here that, in the presence of God and His people, you may enter into the fellowship and communion of His Church. You do truly repent of your sins; you heartily receive Jesus Christ as your crucified Saviour and risen Lord; you consecrate yourselves unto God and your life to His service; you accept His word as your law, and His Spirit as your Comforter and Guide; and, trusting in His grace to confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, you promise to do God's holy will, and to walk with this Church in

the truth and peace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Accepting, according to the measure of your understanding of it, the system of Christian truth held by the Churches of our faith and order, and by this Church into whose fellowship you now enter; you join with ancient saints, with the Church throughout the world, and with us, your fellow-believers, in humbly and heartily confessing your faith in the Gospel, saying: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary; suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; the third day He rose from the dead; He ascended into heaven; and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; the Holy Catholic Church; the Communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting, Amen.

Do you join us in this confession?

(Baptism will here be administered,)

Do you who were baptized in infancy accept that act as your cove nant and seal of consecration?

(Those to be received by letter will here rise and enter into covenant with us.)

Confessing the Lord whom we unitedly worship, you do now renew your self consecration, and cordially join yourself to the membership of this Church in accordance with our christian Faith and Covenant.

(The members of the Church will rise.)

We then, the Pastor and members of this Church, welcome you into our fellowship. We promise to watch over you with Christian love. God grant that, loving and being loved, serving and being served, blessing and being blessed, we may be prepared, while we dwell together on earth for the perfect communion of the saints in heaven.

(The right hand of fellowship to be given here.)

The Lord bless you and keep you. The Lord make His face to shine upon you, and be gracious unto you. The Lord lift up His countenance upon you and give you peace.

Now unto Him that is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of His glory, with exceeding joy, to the only wise God, our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever, Amen.

Form of Infant Baptism.

Suffer little children, and forbid them not to come unto me, for of such is the Kingdom of heaven.—Matt. 19: 14.

For the promise is unto you and your children.—Acts 2: 39.

Believing that it is the privilege of christian parents to dedicate their offspring to God in Baptism,

You do now in the presence of this Church solemnly present this your child, to be thus given away to God—Father, Son and Holy Ghost,—and in reliance upon His grace you promise to bring it up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord, instructing it faithfully in His word, setting before it a becoming example, and by all means in your power seeking its renewal and sanctification, that it may be prepared to take its place as a member of Christ's visible Church on earth, and to dwell among the saints in His heavenly kingdom.

Do you thus heartily engage.

This child, then, I baptize into the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost.

Standing Rules.

- 1. OFFICERS. The permanent officers of this church shall be a Pastor and two or more Deacons. There shall also be chosen by ballot at each annual meeting, a Clerk, a Treasurer, a Sunday School Superintendent, a Librarian, and three members, who, together with the Pastor and Deacons, shall constitute a Standing Committee. Vacancies may be filled at any business meeting, and any other officers, or Committees, may be appointed as may be needed.
- 2. DUTIES OF CLERK. The clerk shall keep a faithful record of all the doings of the church, together with the statistics of the annual reports, and shall submit the same for the inspection of members as they may desire.
- 3. DUTIES OF TREASURER. The Treasurer shall receive, invest and disburse all collections and other funds of the church under its direction, and shall present a written statement of the same at each annual meeting.
- 4. DUTIES OF STANDING COMMITTEE. It shall be the duty of the Standing Committee to examine candidates for church-membership, to present cases for discipline, to conduct other business referred to them by the church, and to have a special oversight of the spiritual interests of the church and congregation.

- 5. MEETINGS. The Pastor shall be Moderator of all church meetings, may call them at his discretion and shall do so at the written request of any five members, which numbers shall constitute a quorum. In the absence, or inability of the Pastor, meetings shall be called by the Chairman of the Standing Committee.
- 6. ANNUAL MEETING. There shall be an annual meeting of the church on the Friday before the first Sabbath in January, with the following order of business: (a) Report of Treasurer. (b) Report of S. S. Superintendent. (c) Report of Standing Committee. (d) Election of Officers. (e) Other Business.
- 7. ADMISSION OF MEMBERS. Applications for membership shall be made to the Standing Committee, and those approved by them shall be propounded at least one week previous to admission. Such persons may then be received under the "Form of Admission" adopted by this church, the vote on reception being taken, when practicable, at the Preparatory service.
- 8. DISMISSION OF MEMBERS. Members removing from us are expected to take letters of dismission and recommendation. Applications for such letters may be acted upon at any regular

meeting. After one years absence, members asking for letters, shall receive only a certificate of good standing when they left us, unless

they give satisfactory reasons for their neglect.

9. DISCIPLINE. Private offences shall be proceeded with according to the rule given in Matt. 18th. A breach of Covenant, consisting of habitual neglect of church ordinances and transfer of church membership, shall receive suitable admonition, and if persisted in, the offender's name may, by vote of the church, be stricken from the church roll. In cases of public offences, the Standing Committee shall make the preliminary investigations, and bring them, at their discretion, before the church for final issue. Complaints against members shall be in writing and a copy furnished to the accused at least one week before church action. Confessions, Votes of Censure, Suspension, or withdrawal of fellowship, in such cases, shall be publicly announced unless the church shall otherwise direct.

10. THE LORD'S SUPPER. The Lord's Supper, preceded by a Preparatory service, shall be regularly administered on the first Sabbath of each alternate month, beginning with January, unless

otherwise ordered by the Deacons.

11. SABBATH SCHOOL. The church shall have the Sabbath School under its special supervision, shall be connected with it so far as practicable and shall in every way exercise a constant and prayerful watch over its interests.

12. SUSPENSION OF RULES. Any Rule of the church may

be suspended by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting.

13. CHANGES. Alterations or amendments in the Doctrinal Statement, Form of Admission, and Standing Rules, may be made at any regular meeting, provided that due notice of the same has been given two weeks previously to the church.
